Here is a fantastic octagonal brass bevelled mirror, dating around 1900, and belonging to the Arts and Crafts movement. The mirror plate is bright and clear, and is framed within a brass frame with a hammered design of scallop shells and foliage. As a note of interest, this particular mirror belonged to a gentleman called Cedric Robinson MBE, who held the intriguing title of 'The Queens Guide to The Sands' which meant he was the noted and official escort across the tidal estuary of Morcambe Bay in the North West of England. The mirror measures 76cm by 45cm, and is in good condition with just the expected surface wear of an item of its age.
