Description

The Mafrash was a small personal-belongings bag which was tied to the flanks of the camel during long migrations. During sedentary periods, the Mafrash was hung from the interior walls of the Yurt. This mafrash was made by Tekke Turkmen tribes in Turkmenistan during the last quarter of the 19th century. It is in very good condition with part-remains of its original flatwoven back and the rather ragged remains of the original tassels. Nevertheless, a lovely example of the type which would make a stunning wall-hanging. 81cm x 66cm (2' 8" x 2' 2").
