Primarily constructed from a carved mahogany and inlaid with striking specimen wood marquetry, the table is supported on barley twist legs with tapering ends and oblate bun feet; joined by a substantial stretcher centred by a finial; the octagonal top with an elaborate pierced apron and radial mahogany veneers set within a marquetry reserve of geometric scrolled designs. The design of the table is seemingly related to the furniture produced by London's James Winter, who was based on Wardour Street.
