The 'Calvert Pattern' was an alternative pattern, used in England during the 19th century, alongside the 'St George', the 'Old English' and the famous 'Staunton' patterns. The 'Calvert' pattern is based on the work of John Calvert of 189, Fleet Street- the chess turner and maker of chess sets in wood and ivory, between 1791 and 1822.
