The tulip-shaped bowl engraved with chequered motifs around a vacant centre. The sides and hollow handle with bright-engraved borders. * from the late 18th to early 19th Century, Birmingham was the centre for the making of "toys": small decorative objects from silver. They were produced in small family businesses and factories throughout Birmingham.
