Description

This beautiful New Hall cabinet plate is painted to the centre with a feathered Tulip, a Forget-Me-Not and a White Rose on a grey background. The cobalt blue rim is decorated with gilt scrolls and moulded white shells. (Painted Pattern No 855). The plate is in excellent condition. There is no restoration, and there are no cracks or chips. The enamels are good. The cobalt still holds its lustre and the gilding is in a good state with only insignificant wear. New Hall takes its name from Shelton Hall near the centre of Hanley in the Potteries and was founded in 1781. The New Hall pottery closed in 1835 but has become increasingly collectible over time. The plate is 28 cms in diameter.
