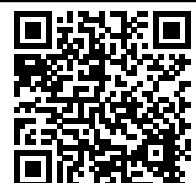
Description

Pair of large Prattware pottery wall pockets, probably Prestonpans, Scotland, c. 1810. The cornucopia shaped wall pockets, moulded with Cupid with a quiver of arrows suspended from swags of flowers in high relief, on a wrythen ground. On one pocket, Cupid drinks from a large bottle, whilst he holds an urn aloft on the other. The rims with bands of stylised acanthus leaves. Coloured in vivid Pratt type enamel, and painted with underglaze blue flowers. Both wall pockets pierced for suspension. Height – 30 cm, 11 3/4". Width – 15.5 cm, 6 1/8". Depth – 8 cm, 3 1/8". Condition – Excellent. No damage. No restoration. My thanks to George Haggerty for the information regarding the belief that these wall pockets were made at Prestonpans, Scotland.
