Description

This is an antique ironstone vase made in the Mason style in England in the second half of the 19th century. The vase has a rather rare form: a hexagonal base, a round body, then an expanding hexagonal neck, with two thin curved side loop handles ending in a mask head on either side of the neck. The main central section of the vase has two different chinoiserie patterns on opposite sides; the patterns are surrounded by gold floral decoration. The vase is brightly hand-painted in gold with distinctive bold enamels in different colors. This is a high-quality piece in the recognizable Mason style, though the shape of the handles and the incorrect markings indicate that this is a high-quality copy and not the original. Dimensions: Height 25.8 cm, width 14.5 cm, depth 12.2 cm. Weight 779 grams. Condition: The vase is in excellent antique condition, with no visible signs of cracks, chips, or restoration.
