Description

Antique earthenware hand painted Satsuma Lidded Koro with decorations made in Kinkozan style end of 19th century. This incense burner raised on three pointed feet, with domed cover with spherical gilded finial, above a globular body, decorated with frieze of woman's figures in scenes of daily life. The piece, artfully decorated by floral patterns in muted colors with gilded handles and feet. The bottom, top edges and the lid are gilded all round. It is typical of intricately decorated Satsuma ware made at kilns in Kyoto during the Meiji period (1868-1912). Although the shape and function of the piece are suited to the Japanese tea ceremony, the use of bright colors and gold made Satsuma ware very popular in the European and American markets. The painting technique employed is called Kyo-Satsuma style and although it's not signed on the bottom, the style is very similar to Kintozan's work. Therefore, we believe that it was made at the Kinkozan factory. The painting technique used in Kyoto's Satsuma-style ware was developed by Kinkozan family.
