The top is engraved 'LW' in fine monogram script. It has a narrow curved form with a bar in relief on either side of the opening. **Date & Origin** Snow Hill, Birmingham, England, 1804. Period of George III. **Condition** Excellent, age-related wear as shown. The hinges are in full working order. **Dimensions** Length & Width: 3.3 cm x 1.3 cm Height: 0.9 cm **Documented Examples** MET museum: <https://www.metmuseum.org/art/collection/search/207446> **Historical Context** Samuel Pemberton was a jeweller and toymaker with a silversmith's workshop located on Snow Hill in Birmingham, England, from the mid-1770s until at least the 1820s. Snow Hill was the centre of Birmingham's jewellery and toy-making district. The Samuel Pemberton family was a long-established West Midlands family that produced silver novelties such as boxes, corkscrews, caddy spoons, and nutmeg graters. His ancestor Roger Pemberton can be traced back to 1509 when he was Mayor of Walsall. Samuel registered silver marks at the B...
