The diamond shaped feet are star cut underneath and the stems are hexagonal and cut in panels. The bowls are of good size and would make a useful and attractive addition to a well laid table. Apart from salt, ideas for other uses are condiments or sauces, such as mint, cranberry, mayonnaise and parmesan. Included are a pair of hallmarked silver gilt spoons. Dimensions below.
