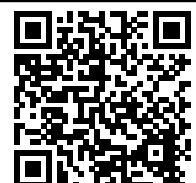

His family moved to Sheffield when he was still a child. At the age of 14, after he had left school, he was apprenticed to William Wichman, a watchmaker, in Sheffield. In those days, apprenticeships were normally indentured, whereby the apprentice would be contracted to the master craftsman for a period of seven years. The apprentice would generally live with the master craftsman and receive a small wage. On completion of the apprenticeship, the apprentice was free to go forth and practice his craft. As a result of his enormously successful business, J.G. Graves is a well-known...
