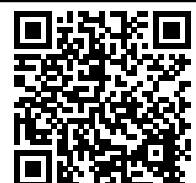

The bases are cut with a multi-point star and there is extensive and matching cut decoration to all parts, including the castellated rims. The lids are removed via a matching cut steeple knob. These outstanding pieces are good collector's items and rather difficult to find, particularly as they are a pair and have all three component parts intact.
