This small and exquisite George III silver caddy spoon is dated Birmingham 1809 and was made by the renowned Birmingham toy maker * Joseph Willmore. The small ovoid bowl finely bright-engraved, the handle with conforming prick-dot decorations. The back fully hallmarked. * from the late 18th to early 19th Century, Birmingham was the centre for the making of "toys": small decorative objects from silver. They were produced in small family businesses and factories throughout Birmingham. They made a range of items including patch boxes, nutmeg graters, buckles, caddy spoons, vinaigrettes, snuff boxes and babies rattles. Hallmarks: IW for Joseph Willmore Duty Mark. Lion Passant.
