UK POSTAGE ONLY FOR THIS ITEM Antique silver LeCoultre split second chronograph pocket watch. The watch has a high grade stem-winding movement which is working nicely. The movement has been identified as being by LeCoultre. We have had sight of identical movements which carry the brevet (patent) number 34029. This relates to a 1905 patent, applicant d'Horlogerie Le Coultre & Cie, relating to the 'instant counter perfected for chronograph timepieces'. LeCoultre went on to become Jaeger LeCoultre in 1937 following a collaboration between Edmond Jaeger and LeCoultre. The split second chronograph is also known as the rattrapante. The rattrapante is a chronograph movement with an additional seconds hand for the chronograph function superimposed over the normal seconds hand and an additional pusher. The winding crown is pushed to set both hands moving round. The extra button (at 2 o'clock) is then pressed to stop one hand while the other continues moving. Then to bring them to together again, press the extra button. To stop both hands moving, press the crown, and again to return to zero. This allows the user to record multiple time intervals that start at the ...
