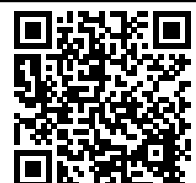
Description

Tall and elegant longcase clock in untouched original condition. The name of the maker is rubbed, but can be made out as being "Ja Harvey". James Harvey was recorded in directories as working in Cross Street, Abergavenny, between 1777 and 1822. A James Tracey Harvey, probably his son, was recorded in High Street in 1830 and Frogmore Street in 1852. The arch has a painting of the parable of Christ at the well with the Samaritan woman, and the corner spandrels are painted with ladies in various poses. The case is of mahogany with flame-mahogany veneers and cross-banding. The hood has a swan neck pediment with brass embellishments and a shaped door flanked by fluted pillars with Corinthian terminals, above a trunk with a long rectangular door flanked by fluted corners, over a plain base raised on front bracket feet. In good original condition with a wonderful surface patination. The movement is complete and original, but may require a service. (Because of the height of my ceiling, the clock is shown without its central brass finial - see close-ups). (A few minor defects to the veneers as might be expected from the age. Missing winding key) Height: 86.5 ins plus 2.5 ins. fin...
