Description

Richard Rooker ebonised double fusee bracket clock and bracket, 6½ins brass arched dial signed Richard Rooker, London on the silvered chapter ring enclosing a foliate engraved matted centre with false bob pendulum and calendar aperture. Movement back plate engraved overall with birds amidst scrolling foliage within a stepped case surmounted by a caddy top and ornate brass carrying handle. 19ins high with pendulum. Richard Rooker was a London-based clockmaker active in the late 17th and early 18th centuries. He was apprenticed to John Clowes in 1686 and became a freeman of the Clockmakers' Company in 1694. His work includes longcase clocks and table timepieces, often featuring intricate marquetry designs and high-quality movements. Some of his clocks, like the Queen Anne ebony table timepiece from around 1705, are highly valued by collectors. His craftsmanship is recognized for its precision and aesthetic appeal, making his clocks sought after in the antique market.
