Huge Pair Karl Herrle Bavarian Gothic Castle and Landscape Oil Paintings. Schloss Hohenschwangau. Signed and dated: Karl Herrle, 1887. Extremely finely painted views of Bavaria Castle / Schloss Hohenschwangau with landscape scenes. Superb detailing of Romanesque, Gothic, and Byzantine architectural styles. The genre reflecting the idealized vision of Bavarian Royalty, and Life of the "Fairy Tale King" Ludwig II who grew up in Schloss Hohenschwangau. Karl Herrle studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich and is known for his dramatic landscapes with Bavarian castles (Schlösses), and finely detailed German railway scenes. This pair of Bavarian Castle and Landscape oil paintings likely to have been of 'special commission' (circa 1886) - Possibly before the death of Ludwig II in June 1886. Hohenschwangau Castle (German: Schloss Hohenschwangau): 19th-century palace in southern Germany. Built by King Maximilian II of Bavaria, and was the childhood residence of his son, King Ludwig II of Bavaria. Located in the German village of Hohenschwangau near the town of Füssen, part of the county of Ostallgäu in southwestern Bavaria, Germany, very close to the border with Austria....
