In the manner of Louis-Auguste-Alfred Beurdeley, it features intricate gilded ormolu mounts that enhance its luxurious appeal. The cabinet includes a single frieze drawer for storage and a striking central panel adorned with Japanese-style lacquer, depicting serene landscapes. Its design harmoniously blends traditional European craftsmanship with Asian influences, making it a captivating piece of furniture history. The attention to detail and quality materials reflect the opulence of the period, making this cabinet a remarkable addition to any collection. The renowned company of Beurdeley was one of the most prestigious furniture makers of the 19th Century. The business was founded in 1818 by Jean Beurdeley (1772-1853), who established the firm's first workshop in Paris. After Jean's death, his son Louis-Auguste-Alfred (1808-1882) took over the business, channelling his energies into producing furniture inspired by the Louis XVI and Louis XVIII styles. Louis-Auguste-Alfred quickly established himself as one of the most skilled cabinet makers (ébénistes) of the...

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
