It is a very good example of its type and although of typical form it boasts great elegance. It's also a good, practical functional size and it is constructed using the good quality, well figured rosewood veneers. The word Étagère is derived from the French word for a set of open freestanding shelves and although in England the term Whatnot is much more common the two phrases are pretty much always interchangeable these days, although more often than not you will find that the term Whatnot is used to describe larger variations of this design, whereas Étagère will be used to d...
