Their combined estimated weight is circa 0.50ct, with H colour and SI clarity, ensuring excellent sparkle and period charm. Fully hallmarked at the venerable Chester Assay Office in 1896, this ring is wonderfully preserved – a testament to its quality and cherished history. Substantial in form, smooth in wear, and exceptionally stylish, it makes a distinctive heirloom piece for any jewellery connoisseur.
