Both stand on circular wooden socle bases, giving the lamps a balanced and elegant presentation. The lamps have been electrified at some point in their history; however, they will require new plugs before use. About Émile Bruchon Émile Bruchon (active late 19th–early 20th century) was a French sculptor and decorative artist known for his elegant neoclassical and allegorical figures, often produced in spelter or bronze. His workshop created popular decorative pieces—statues, clocks, and lamps—recognisable for their graceful poses and fine detailing.
