The chair stands on four legs joined by a stretchered base, providing strength and stability, and features an arched hoop back with turned spindles, a classic and recognisable characteristic of traditional Windsor chairs. The shaped elm seat offers good comfort, while the beech frame and spindles reflect the practical construction methods commonly used in early English Windsor chairmaking. A versatile piece, suitable for use as a hall chair, kitchen chair, or occasional country chair, and equally at home in a traditional or modern interior. About Windsor Chairs Windsor chairs originated in England in the early 18th century, with their name traditionally linked to the Windsor area of Berkshire. They were first used as practical outdoor and garden seating before becoming popular inside country houses and farmhouses. Their design favoured locally available woods, with elm commonly used for the seat and beech for the legs and spindles, allowing for strong construction and ease of repair.
