Description

A Staffordshire pearlware jug dating to around 1790–1800, of compact proportions with rounded body, fluted neck and neatly shaped pouring spout. This smaller format is distinctly less common than larger Staffordshire jugs of the period. The body is moulded with cabbage-leaf relief panels outlined in brown enamel feathering with serrated edges. Within the panels are freely painted floral sprigs in polychrome enamels, all applied by hand. The rim is finished with a simple foliate relief border picked out in blue and green enamels, uneven in execution and characteristic of early workmanship. The pearlware body has a pale bluish-white tone. The base is unmarked, in keeping with Staffordshire practice. Comparable examples have been tentatively attributed to William Baddeley and Booth's of Stoke, as noted in auction and dealer literature. A rare small-format jug with clear decorative and collector appeal. Dimensions: Height 13 cm Width 12 cm Depth 9 cm Weight 172 g Condition: Excellent antique condition.
