A Lovely Pair of Antique Victorian Silver Salt Cellars features ornate pierced silver holders with claw-and-ball feet, deep cobalt blue glass liners, and silver salt spoons with gilded bowls. Each spoon is engraved with a delicate script monogram "F," adding a personal and historical touch, and features gilt interiors, a traditional finish for salt spoons to protect the silver and prevent tarnishing from salt. Their timeless design combines beauty and utility - an exquisite example of 19th-century tableware made to impress. Salt Cellars are hallmarked for Sheffield, 1842. Spoons are hallmarked for London, 1867. * While the cobalt glass liners differ slightly in design, one featuring a star-cut base and the other plain, this variation is typical of antique sets and both fit their silver holders perfectly, indicating they are original or period-correct replacements.
