An exceptional pair of William IV silver grape scissors, crafted by the renowned silversmiths Charles Reily & George Storer, London, 1834. These elegant and substantial scissors feature superbly cast handles in bold vine and leaf form, a classic motif of the period rendered here with crisp, sculptural detail. The casting is particularly fine and remains sharp and well-defined throughout, a testament to the quality of early 19th-century London silversmithing. The ornate vine motif is emblematic of early Victorian silverware, yet these remain rooted in the elegance of late Georgian design — ideal for collectors of English silver, and a sophisticated addition to any fine dining setting. The scissor action is tight and smooth, functioning perfectly as both a decorative and practical piece. Hallmarks are clear and well struck, attesting to the maker and date. Measuring 18cm in length and weighing 3.7 troy ounces (117 grams), these are a fine and functional piece of table silver, perfect for formal dining or as a distinguished gift.
