Description

A John Rose Coalport Porcelain Sucrier c.1805 - 1812. The Oval Shape Sucrier with solidly gilded 'Dolphin' handles, painted in pattern 765 in the manner of Thomas Pardoe with stylised orange and yellow flowers with green and gilt foliage, set against a deep blue ground. Marked in pattern 765 in gold to the base of the Sucrier. Condition: Very good with minimal wear to the gilding and decoration. Just a small 'X' shape crack only visible to the inside of the sucrier. This pattern occurs in factory-decorated Coalport, bearing a Coalport pattern number. However, it is also seen on an important tea and coffee service decorated by Thomas Pardoe for Lord Milford in 1818. Some pieces bear script marks to that effect. Thomas Pardoe set up business in Bath Street, Bristol after leaving Swansea. Finished pieces were probably fired at the nearby Water Lane Pottery, see Welsh Ceramics in Context II, p.137. It seems likely Pardoe bought Coalport blanks bearing only the underglaze blue and finished the decoration himself. Unmarked Pardoe examples are distinguished from the factory-decorated version by the use of the Garter star motif and other subtle differences in the painted deta...
