The awl and sheath are both hallmarked with the sword mark, along with a makers mark to the awl. To the top of the awl is a octagonal loop for attaching to a chatelaine and the body of the sheath is hexagon is shape, with delightful engraved details to all sides. The awl has a screw thread, allowing it to be securely located into the sheath to avoid loss. A lovely and usable piece of silverware. Dimensions below.
