The jays' distinctive soft brown plumage, black facial markings and vibrant blue barred wing feathers are wonderfully detailed, making this display both an impressive decorative object and a fascinating natural history specimen. Encased in a classic glazed display box with a painted interior backdrop, it offers depth and character while protecting the birds within. Antique taxidermy pieces like this were originally created for natural history collectors, country houses and curiosity cabinets, and today they are highly sought after for eclectic interiors, collectors of curiosities and traditional British décor.
