A very fine and detailed Water Colour painting by George Goodwin Kilburne 1839 - 1924 "Repairing the damages" a lady sat upright on a hall seat repairing lace whilst a young girl offers her a sewing basket, looking on from a further room stand a couple in discussion perhaps conversing of what led to damages being repaired? Signed by the artist bottom right. A really pleasing subject the painting retains its unfaded colours and is presented in a attractive gilt frame. Frame size 52cm tall x 61cm wide Picture size 25cm tall x 35.5cm wide George Goodwin Kilburne,[1] R.I., R.O.I, R.M.S, (24 July 1839 – 1924 London) was an English genre painter specialising in accurately drawn interiors with figures. He favoured the watercolour medium, although he also worked in oils, pencil and initially trained as a wood-engraver. Kilburne was educated at Hawkhurst, Kent – his father's old school. On leaving at the age of 15, he went to London to serve a five-year apprenticeship as a wood-engraver with the Dalziel brothers. He was highly regarded by his employers, who described him as "industrious and constant" and "one of the most satisfactory pupils we ever had." [4] His time as an engr...
