Description These finely crafted vases demonstrate an exceptional level of workmanship, with **extremely delicate wirework (cloisons)** forming intricate designs, in places as fine as 1mm in width. Each vase features richly detailed decoration including: **Floral motifs**: Sakura cherry blossom, lotus, chrysanthemum, anemone, and peony **Traditional ‘takara-mono’ (treasure objects)** within decorative roundels **Striking overlapping green scale patterning** **Gilded wirework and jewelled enamel highlights** The elegant **eight-lobed form** further enhances the complexity of the design, with the enamel work carefully applied across each curved surface – a testament to the te...
