Design & Craftsmanship The circular case is a master class in early 19th-century goldsmithing: The Lid: Features a stunning, crisp engine-turned (guilloché) canter, framed by an exquisite, hand-chased wreath of leaves and berries in contrasting two-colour gold. The Body: The sides are decorated with deep, crisp floral chasing, maintaining a remarkable tactile quality. The Interior: Opens to reveal a flawlessly preserved, hand-pierced gold grille featuring a delicate floral/snowflake motif.
