Description

Description An exceptionally rare 18th-century engraved pedestal wine goblet, produced in England circa 1730. It features a pointed round funnel bowl with a solid base enclosing a single central air tear. The bowl is engraved with a ceremonial United Netherlands armorial. The glass stands on a shoulder half knop (a rare feature) above a six-sided pedestal (Silesian-type) stem, incorporating a long air column forming a hollow section to the lower stem. It is raised on a rib-moulded domed foot, with a rough snapped pontil to the underside. The Engraving: A wheel engraving of the coat of arms of the Republic of the Seven United Netherlands (1581–1795) - the precursor to the modern Dutch Royal Coat of Arms. It features a crowned lion rampant holding a sword and seven arrows, representing the united provinces, strength, and sovereignty. The motto is engraved with a diamond-point tool: "CONCORDIA RES PARVÆ CRESCUNT", which translates as "Harmony makes small things grow", and was used to reflect the nature of the Republic. It is difficult to overstate just how rare an English armorial engraved pedestal stem is. So few examples are known that attempting to quantify their rarity i...
