The craze for lacquer in the west from the 16th century onwards has been extensively documented and it is generally accepted that the finest of all lacquers, technically speaking, were those produced in Japan rather than China. This cabinet is one of the best examples of Japanese export lacquer. The lacquer work on the cabinet, executed in a variety of techniques including Maki-e, is exquisite and survives in amazing condition.
