This splendid teapot is of a delightful lobed melon shape and is profusely chased with half ribbed fluting decoration with a short fluted scroll spout and leaf-capped handle on a shaped foot, with a hinged cover with a decorative compressed finial, stamped Storr & Mortimer 188 to the base. It features an exceptional novelty leaf-capped handle with striking details, proving the silversmith's exceptional mastery in the creation of unique and luxurious silverware - Paul Storr never tired of adding detail to create a true piece of artwork. The underside of the teapot, as well as the lid, bears full hallmarks: the Lion passant for sterling silver, the leopard head for London, the letter 'P' for 1830 and the maker's marks 'PS' for Paul Storr.
