This rare pair of Arnhem Art Nouveau/Secessionist twin-handled glazed vases features a distinctive floral design with thin blue lines, floral decoration, and crazing throughout, with a small base rim chip to one. Origin: Manufactured by the Arnhemsche Fayencefabriek in the Netherlands, likely between 1907 and 1920. Design: Designed by Klaas or Jacob Vet, showcasing characteristic Art Nouveau floral motifs. Dimensions: These specific vases measure approximately 27 cm height. Incredibly stylish and highly decorative. Klaas and Jacob Vet were Dutch brothers and renowned masters of early 20th-century Art Nouveau (Nieuwe Kunst) pottery. They founded two significant ceramic factories in the Netherlands, celebrated for their matte white glazes, delicate linear decorations, and stylized natural motifs. Key Milestones and Factories JB. Vet & Co. (Purmerend, 1903–1906): The brothers pooled their expertise—Klaas as a modeller and Jacob as a pottery painter—to establish their first factory. This venture became known for its graceful simplicity and linear designs. Arnhemsche Fayencefabriek (Arnhem, 1907–1917): After a devastating fire destroyed the Purmerend factory, the brothers relocat...

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
