Fretwork panels to the hood pediment front and sides. A brass lenticle to the trunk door showing the pendulum. An 11 3/4" brass and silvered dial signed 'D Lestourgeon, London'. Wheatear chased border engraving with crown and cherub corner spandrels. A date and seconds dial. A rarer, month duration, high quality mechanism striking the hours on a bell. Circa 1710. David Lestourgeon of London is recorded in Baillies' 'The Early Clockmakers of Great Britain' book. He moved from Rouen in 1681 to London.
