Carl Haag Carl Haag (1820-1915) was a distinguished artist born in Bavaria, who later became a naturalised British citizen. His artistic journey began with formal training at the Academy of Fine Arts in Nuremberg and Munich, where he honed his skills in illustration and oil painting. Seeking new opportunities, Haag moved to England in 1847, where he embraced the medium of watercolour, mastering the techniques that would define his career.
