The glass etched on the sides with the amount of "teaspoons" and "tablespoons," along with a tiny vile etched with "drops" each stored in a round maroon leather travel case. The top of the interior cover is marked in gilded letters S, Maw, Son & Thompson, London. In 1814 George Maw, a former Lincolnshire farmer, purchased a surgical plaster factory at Whitecross Street in London. The factory soon began to manufacture surgical instruments and later expanded to produce a variety of medical and pharmaceutical products.
