Description

William Shayer (b. 1787 d. 1879). The son of a publican, born in Southampton, William was a self taught artist who became known for his oils on canvas of countryside scenes with working people and their animals in front of inns, barns and farm houses – many were painted in the New Forest. William married twice during his long life and had ten children, the eldest of which - William Joseph Shayer Junior – also became an acclaimed artist and his paintings are very similar in style and composition to his father's. William senior's work is reminiscent of paintings by George Morland and has great depth and liveliness, unusual for the period, due to his application of a thin layer of clear glaze over the dry oil paint. William senior exhibited at the major British Institutions including the Royal Academy and the British Institution and his works are now on display at museums in London, Glasgow and New York along with many others. Here an original oil on canvas of a countryside building with two horses and a setter by William Shayer senior and painted in around 1830.
