## Description

A finely decorated pair of Japanese Satsuma vases attributed to the Shozan workshop (昭山), dating from circa 1900-1910. Both vases have elegant slender baluster forms and are painted with complementary continuous scenes of Japanese women and children in an extensive temple garden. The figures appear among traditional pavilions, water, distant mountains and cascading purple wisteria. The shoulders are decorated with alternating brocade-style panels in pale blue, mauve, green and gold. Finely drawn gilt details, patterned borders and gilded rims complete the decoration. The ivory-coloured bodies display the fine crackled glaze characteristic of Satsuma earthenware. Each vase bears the two-character Shozan mark 昭山 in gilt within a black rectangular cartouche, accompanied by the Shimazu cross emblem.
