A rare and collectable item of Georgian silver table-ware. This is a delightful small sifting ladle for applying spices directly to food - a common practice in Georgian times. It is double struck (pattern front and back) and is in the sought after Fiddle & Thread pattern. To the top front is an armorial. Condition :- Excellent, with no dents or splits. To the reverse of the shank are two light lines, caused by the continuous wear against the spice bottle. Hallmarks :- Clear and readable. Town mark is missing but will be London - confirmed by Maker's mark. Maker :- Richard Crossley. Length :- 12.5 cms. Bowl diameter :- 3.25 cms.
