A fine quality 18th century mahogany chair combining Rococo and Gothic motifs. Beautiful crisp carving, excellent colour, the best quality dense mahogany and totally sound. The seat is covered in good quality black hide. Thomas Chippendale born at Otley, West Riding of Yorkshire, born 1718 – died 1779) was a London cabinet-maker and furniture designer in the mid-Georgian, English Rococo, and Neoclassical styles. In 1754 he published a book of his designs, titled "The Gentleman and Cabinet Maker's Director". The designs are regarded as reflecting the current London fashion for furniture for that period and were used by other cabinet makers outside London. DIMENSIONS: height 39 inches, width 21.5 inches.
