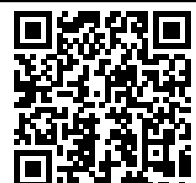
Rare set of 5 numbered C19th iron-bound oak Country-House 'silver-chests' . A consecutively numbered set of chests or trunks originally made to transport the silver of an English noble family from town to country residences. Heavily constructed with all original iron-bound strapping , hasps and carrying handles. Each chest has been adapted to house a single fitted removable tray above the open void beneath. All locks have been altered and do not function , and no keys are present. Each chest has a gently arched dome-top profile , but are flat enough for use as a table . All fitted with an engraved brass plaque numbered 1-5 , bearing the inscription "The Hon. Hubert Beaumont" . Hubert Beaumont (1864-1922) was a British Liberal Party politician , styled The Honourable from 1906.
