The spoon is bottom marked (hallmarks above the reverse of the bowl) and has engraved marriage initials to the reverse top of the shank. The spoon has the advantage of being Britannia standard silver and bears an interesting additional hallmark - P in a square cartouche. A wonderful early collector's piece.
