Description

Pair of early C19th George IV period mahogany salver or charger display stands. Scarce pair of mahogany 'country-house' stands designed to display silver salvers, dishes or porcelain chargers upon on a sideboard or serving table. The rectangular weighted plinth bases with a simply moulded top edge, surmounted by ebonised 'split' baluster turned mouldings to form rests to house chargers of varied diameters at different angles. The broad strut back supports having a raked angle. The edges of the struts with a sophisticated carved 'egg-and-dart' detail. Similar stands were produced by the esteemed cabinet-making firm of Gillows of Lancaster and London. (Examples can be seen in Susan E.
