An extremely rare set of three Victorian bar bottles. These very large examples would have stood in a Victorian bar or ale house and have corks rather than stoppers, for easy serving and refilling. They are of substantial proportions and etched with names and fruiting vines. The shoulders, bodies and necks are slice cut and each bottle has a flared rim and applied neck ring. The bases are each cut with a star. One is for Brown Sherry, another P Brandy (presumably pale brandy) and the last is Noyeau, which was an almond based creme liqueur made from peach kernels.
