A rare and historical little box made from English sterling silver with a full hallmark for Birmingham 1917 during the First World War. German U-boats would target ships bring supplies to England, including sugar which lead to sugar rationing and restaurants and cafes without sugar, one would have to take along one's personal supply, this box would have been made for this. The lid fits well and the domed top is engraved "Sugar". Once opened the interior reveals a lavishly gilded interior. An interesting piece for any English silver collection or it would make the perfect pill box if you wanted to put it to use. The box is fully hallmarked for Birmingham 1917 together with the makers initials for the well renowned silversmith, Levi and Salaman.
