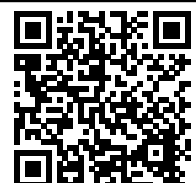
Description

Framed watercolour by the well listed artist Alfred Bastien. The painting shows a scene with a farmer and two horses working the field. It is framed and mounted in a simple frame and slip. It dates from the early 20th century. Alfred Théodore Joseph Bastien (16 September 1873, in Ixelles – 7 June 1955, in Uccle) was a Belgian artist, academic, and soldier. He attended the Académie Royale des Beaux-Arts in Ghent, where he studied with Jean Delvin. He then enrolled in the Académie Royale des Beaux-Arts in Brussels, where he studied with Jean-François Portaels. He won the Prix Godecharle there in 1897. Bastien then traveled to Paris, where he enrolled in the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris. He was in Paris when hostilities broke out in what would become the First World War. Alfred Bastien was a Post-Impressionist painter and watercolourist of landscapes, still lifes and portraits. He travelled on a scholarship to Paris in 1891, where he won the "Prix de Godecharle" in 1897. He also travelled to North Africa, the Belgian Congo, India, Japan, China and the islands of the South Pacific, all of which inspired his work. Dimensions - 45 x 38 cm
