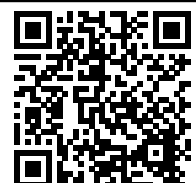
A 19th Century fruitwood lace maker's stool with original iron stretchers to accommodate the clogs worn by the workers. The stool stands on turned legs. The stool is in original condition, with lovely areas of wear and the thick seat has a double rim with good colour and patina. The condition of this antique stool is good, especially considering its long life of practical use. There is slight wear to the base of one leg, this does not affect the stability of the stool and it stands solidly with no wobbles. A good example of industry in the early 19th Century when English lace makers worked in their own home.
